DOG OWNER JAILED

Lisa Garner, 45, was walking her Doberman in Havant, Hampshire, when it mauled a three-year-old girl in August, leaving her with wounds that required surgery and permanent scars. Garner admitted being in charge of a dangerously out of control dog.

During a hearing at Portsmouth Crown Court, she was also disqualified from owning dogs for 10 years.

The court was told the little girl was walking on the pavement with her grandmother on Botley Drive when the "terrifying and traumatic" attack happened

Garner accepted that the child in no way provoked the dog, which it took several members of the public to overpower before it would loosen its grip, the court heard.

The court was told Garner had previously joked about how the dog, called El Chapo, attacked a cat and that locals had expressed concerns about its behaviour on social media groups

The court heard she acquired the ex-guard dog from a rescue centre and had owned it for about six months

Garner told officers sent to question her after the attack that despite "looking evil" the dog was in fact "just a big doughnut

The dog was later euthanized

MICRO CHIP SCAMM

A website that claims to offer pet microchip registration is scamming pet owners. The Chartered Trading Standards Institute (CTSI) has issued a warning about the website, called UK Pet Chip Registry, which is advertised under Google search results for 'pet microchipping'. The service claims that for a charge of £15, it will add the pet's microchip details to the so-called 'National Pet Microchip Registration Database'. However, that database does not meet UK Government standards and is not on the list of government-endorsed pet databases.

POLLUTION

Things have not improved with the pollution of our beaches. For those of us that use Aldwick beach the news is even worse, with the beach being one of two along the south coast to be deemed unsuitable for bathing due to sewage pollution caused by Southern Waters intentional discharges. Anyone that takes their Dog to the beach should be cautious about allowing them to swim in the sea due to the massive amount of raw sewage that is being discharged some of it according to Southern Water, caused by excessive rain fall. Surfers against sewage (SAS) have issued new warnings which identifies virtually all of the south coast as polluted with Aldwick identified as unsuitable for bathing

Obviously raw sewage is not something that most people would choose to swim in, frequent updates by Surfers Against Sewage, via their App, will give useful updates on the specific places where it is not advisable for you or your Dog to swim. Celebrity Vet Marc Abraham, a regular on TV news shows, said owners should stop their pets from going in the sea while raw sewage is rife in Sussex.
