CRUFTS 2024

Crufts will be held on 7-10th March 2024 at the NEC Birmingham.

Thursday will be the Utility & Toys, Friday the Gundogs, Saturday the Working & Pastoral, and Sunday the Terrier & Hounds and also of course the Best in Show. As usual there will also be many activities including Flyball, Agility and Heelwork to Music. The Show is also being covered daily by Channel 4 and More 4, with special events shown on You Tube.

NEW DOG CONTROL ORDERS

At a meeting of Arun District Council Environment Committee on 7 September 2023, councillors unanimously voted through the proposed renewal and extension of the Dog control Orders for the next three years. These new Orders came into force on 6 November 2023 to set out the rules that dog owners must adhere to, to protect the district under the Anti-Social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014. This is covered by the use four different Public Space Protection Orders: The fouling of land by Dogs, The Dogs on lead by-direction, The Dogs exclusion and The Dogs on leads order.

The changes from the previous order and are based upon feedback from the public, stakeholders, town and parish councils, other organisations and first-hand experience in managing land and enforcement issues in relation to dog controls.

The following new areas have been added to the locations where dogs are required to be kept on leads; Place St Maur (and other future water play areas), and in Discovery Garden in Hotham Park, both in Bognor Regis and West Beach Board Walk (off Rope Walk), Littlehampton

DOG THEFT

Dog theft is still prevalent in this area, with Sussex being fourth in the league table for Dog theft over the past six years. The findings are based on information obtained through Freedom of Information requests (FOIs) sent to 45 UK police constabularies, of which 24 responded.

SEA WATER SEWAGE

As most will be aware, Southern Water continue to dump raw sewage into our sea and rivers, with one High profile vet warning on the dangers of letting dogs swim in sewage-infested seawater.

Veterinary surgeon Marc Abraham, a regular guest on TV news shows, said owners should stop their pets from going in the sea while raw sewage is rife in Sussex.

Dogs can contract illnesses such as gastroenteritis by ingesting poisonous seawater directly or from licking their fur after a swim.

"It's preventable by not letting their dog swim in the sea," said Marc, who lives in the County.

"There have been cases in the news. It can cause vomiting and diarrhoea, and be bloody expensive if they are hospitalised, at around one or two thousand pounds."
