VET HOSPITAL IN CHICHESTER

With the appalling situation with the shortage of good Vets in the area and the current need to travel to Portsmouth, Winchester or Storrington for out of hours and specialist treatment, it is welcome news that a new Animal Hospital run by independent Vets AVG has opened at Chichester. It opened in September 2021 and so far there have only been positive feedback. Some of the Vets will be familiar to ex Alpha Pets clients with our own President Laura among them.

Another independent Vets called Huckleberries opened in 2021 at the Vinnetrow Business Park, Chichester.

Although in Littlehampton, Stellar Vets are a small friendly independent Vets that come highly recommended with the "luxury" of seeing the same Vet and ease of getting appointments.

WHY WE ARE THE CHEAPEST DOG TRAINING

We get numerous telephone calls from people wishing to train their dogs with us and when told the fees they are astonished and we usually get "That's cheap!" . We have run Bognor Regis & District Dog Training Club for over fifty years on a non-profit making basis. We need to cover the cost of running the club which includes the ever increasing cost of hiring the hall for two evenings a week

We are definitely NOT inferior to the other more expensive Dog training clubs in the area. All of our ten Trainers are fully qualified with the majority having been Trainers for many years and all are unpaid Volunteers. We cater not only for the "pet" market, but also for people who wish to enter their dogs for competition or for the show ring. Our three yearly terms are between twelve and fourteen weeks (depending on where Easter falls each Spring). For this our fees are £36.00 per term for each dog. In addition, we charge £3.00 a year club subscription for each club member, which is mandatory.

ALABAMA ROT - UPDATE

Anderson Moore Veterinary Specialists urges dog owners to remain vigilant after confirming the first two cases of cutaneous and renal glomerular vasculopathy (Alabama rot) in 2022. The referral centre has now confirmed two new cases of Alabama rot since 1 January in Ashtead, Surrey, and Wokingham, Berkshire. Fortunately there have not been any in this area.
