#### POLLUTION

Everyone is by now aware of the illegal pollution of the sea and beaches which is being regularly carried out by Southern Water. Whilst this has recently been a much publicised topic of news, it is however nothing new, it has been going on for many years.

In a recent TV News item, a Woman from Southern water assured everyone that the discharge was 95% rain water, (this means 5% raw sewage !) . Whilst she was referring to the pipes which are directly on the beaches and may be true (or more likely not), she failed to mention the frequent discharges at places like Pagham Harbour, Dell Quay and Chichester Harbour which are definitely not 95% rainwater, they are 100% raw sewage, and when the wind is in the right direction, your nose will confirm this fact.

Obviously raw sewage is not something that most people would choose to swim in, frequent updates by Surfers Against Sewage, via their App, will give useful updates on the specific places where it is not advisable for you or your Dog to swim. Celebrity Vet Marc Abraham, a regular on TV news shows, said owners should stop their pets from going in the sea while raw sewage is rife in Sussex.
